Jean-Louis Delvaux began his career at the World Bank in Washington in 1970, serving as an Investment Officer at the International Finance Corporation, a position he held for five years.

In 1975, he entered the nascent private equity sector in Paris, first as an investor with Groupe IDI (1975–1980), then as the founder and Administrative Director of the "Institut de Développement des Industries Agricoles et Alimentaires", an investment fund dedicated to the agri-food industry.

He joined Natixis Private Equity in 1990 and held numerous senior roles until 2010, managing funds across Europe, China, India, Brazil, and the United States, where he played a key role in launching local operations. His titles included Executive Vice President for International Affairs, Deputy CEO in charge of International Development, and Chairman of both the Board of Directors and Supervisory Board of Natexis Private Equity International.

Jean-Louis Delvaux also served on the boards of the European Private Equity & Venture Group Association and France Invest (formerly the French Private Equity Association).

Among his other professional experiences, he was Secretary General *of Financière Saint Dominique* (1990–1995) and Executive Director at *Compagnie Financière Jean-Paul Elkan* (1996–1999).
